

Seniawan town is a classic case study of a successful rehabilitation project converting a sleepy town bypassed by major highways and with nearby city developments stealing its young. The 2 rows of crumbling 19th century wooden shop houses were painstakingly restored to its former glory. The town now attracts visitors with its bustling weekend night market permeating sights, smells and sounds. There is a galore of hawker food as well as proper restaurants and pubs.
